Brief biographies of some of the speakers

Donna Willard-Moore, BFA, MA, MFA is an Artist, sculptor, art historian, iconographer, public presenter, researcher and joined NP Branch of the Theosophical Society in 2010.

Jim Scrivener is a retired architect with an interest in music and theosophy. He plays french horn in the Taranaki Symphony Orchestra and since 1988 has been involved in various roles of the NP Branch of the Theosophical Society.

Nicola Haines is a Teacher, installation Artist and Designer, based in Taranaki. She has had a lifelong interest in Spirituality and Ancient traditions, and joined the New Plymouth Branch of the Theosophical Society in 2018

Benjamin Upton is a software developer from New Plymouth who spends his spare time uncovering the connections between the scientific and the spiritual. A keen follower of scientific theories that have been swept under the carpet by the mainstream scientific dogma, he hopes one day we as a collective will experience a consciousness renaissance.

Barry Bowden—Barry will tell you, nature has been his *areatest teacher!*

He worked with farming for many years as a Biodynamic farmer through the processes of nature, both challenging and rewarding. How there is a process going on inwardly, a sensitization through nature, which always stimulates the inward life. Carefully guided by an understanding of deeper Theosophical truths, this knowledge has helped him understand himself. How this is the key to understanding others and life itself. His passion is Theosophy. Theosophy illuminates the hidden processes of nature, which when understood become practical. He aspires to help people realize the hidden potential within themselves, and awaken the their inner life, and is a National lecturer for the Theosophical Society in Australia as well as being involved in Toowoomba group and Brisbane Lodge. He spent time recently in Brazil, as a quest at their Theosophical farm and speaking at the South American Convention.

Even if you can't make it to meetings, bear in mind the subscriptions are at a similar level to those for National Section members who are not affiliated to any branch, but still receive the magazine and all the other advantages of membership.

Why is there, one must ask, this division – the Russian, the American, the British, French, German, and so on – why is there this division between human and human, between race and race, culture and culture, one series of ideologies against another? Why? Why is there this separation? Humanity has divided the Earth as yours and mine – why? Is it that we try to find security, self protection, in a particular group, or in a particular belief, faith? For religions also have divided humanity, put person against person – the Hindus, the Muslins, the Christians, the Jews, and so on. Nationalism, with its unfortunate patriotism, is really a glorified form, an ennobled form, of tribalism... This terrible desire to identify oneself with the group, with a flag, with a religious ritual, and so on, give us the feeling that we have roots, that we are not homeless wanderers. There is the desire, the urge, to find one's roots ...

It is our Earth, not yours or mine or his. We are meant to live on it, helping each other, not destroying each other. This is not some romantic nonsense but the actual fact. But humanity has divided the Earth, hoping that it is going to find happiness, security, a sense of abiding comfort. Until a radical change takes place and we wipe out all nationalities, all ideologies, all religious divisions and establish a global relationship – psychologically first, inwardly before organising the outer – we shall go on with war. If you harm others, if you kill others, whether in anger or by organised murder which is called war, you, who are the rest of humanity, not a separate human being fighting the rest of humanity, are destroying yourself.
